THE BISON NICKNAME

Early last century, Bucknell teams had no definitive nickname. To remedy this situation, the late William C. Bartol, a long-time professor of mathematics and astronomy at Bucknell, suggested, about 1910, that the nickname "Bisons" be adopted.

Geography was the main reason for the choice of the name. Bucknell's campus lies at the eastern end of the Buffalo Valley, which was one of the last stumping grounds of the American bison, or buffalo, in this part of the country. It is estimated that at one time, at least 10,000 bison roamed the reaches of the Buffalo Valley. As late as 1799, more than 300 were reported. The last buffalo in this section is believed to have been shot in 1800 at Buffalo Crossroads, about six miles from Bucknell.

The nickname currently used by most writers and broadcasters is "Bison," believed to be a more accurate use of the plural of the word bison.

Bucknell University, ranked among the top national liberal arts colleges in the nation, is a privately owned, co-educational institution with an undergraduate enrollment of approximately 3,350 students and a faculty of some 270 teachers, of which over 97 percent hold doctoral degrees.

The 100th college chartered in the United States, Bucknell was founded by Philadelphia Baptists in 1846 as the University at Lewisburg. The first class of seven men graduated in 1851 with the first woman receiving her degree in 1885. In 1886, the institution was renamed Bucknell University in honor of William Bucknell, a former trustee and benefactor.

A comprehensive university, Bucknell allows students to choose from many academic options, including 53 majors and 64 minors. In learning from and collaborating with experienced faculty, students will have access to state-of-the-art resources within the library, laboratory, computer center, multi-media room, and recreational facility.

Enrolling at Bucknell allows one to acquire global connections through the International Focus Semester Program, Semester of Studying Abroad Program, and interaction with students and faculty from various countries and continents. Through the University's commitment to diversity, students of all ethnic, racial, geographical, intellectual, and political backgrounds converge on one campus to foster a community of acceptance and exploration in diversity. As a member of the Bucknell and Lewisburg communities, students are able to find their own niche while learning the importance of values.



The University's physical plant, located on a 400-acre campus overlooking the Susquehanna River, includes more than 80 buildings. Recent additions include a \$1 million computer center constructed as a wing of the Dana Engineering Building, an \$8.2 million addition to the Ellen Clarke Bertrand Library, the \$9.7 million Weis Performing Arts Center, and the \$10.9 million Robert L. Rooke Chemistry Building and adjoining biology building.

In addition, construction of the Sigfried Weis Music Building was completed in the summer of 2001 in time for its doors to open for the fall semester. The new \$7 million music instruction building was one facet of *The Bucknell Campaign*, the most ambitious in Bucknell's 154-year history. A new residence hall facility opened in 2001 and houses 300 students within "neighborhoods" — a contemporary design intended to promote a sense of community.

And finally, the sparkling Kenneth G. Langone Athletics and Recreation Center opened in 2003, providing a state-of-the-art facility for varsity athletes and students, staff and faculty alike.

Bucknell is easily accessible, located on U.S. Route 15 approximately 60 miles north of Harrisburg and 25 miles south of Williamsport. The campus is seven miles south of Interstate 80 on Route 15.



THE KENNETH G. LANGONE ATHLETICS & RECREATION CENTER

The Bucknell University Department of Athletics and Recreation prides itself on setting the standard of excellence when it comes to success both on the playing fields and in the classroom. With 11 Patriot League Presidents' Cups in 14 years, annual top-10 national rankings in graduation rates, 107 Verizon Academic All-Americans in 33 years and 94 Patriot League Scholar-Athletes in 14 years, Bucknell is clearly at the head of the class in terms of upholding the scholar-athlete model.

The addition of the Kenneth G. Langone Athletics and Recreation Center, one of the finest collegiate athletics and recreation facilities of its kind in the nation, will help ensure the continuation of that success.

The facility enhances each of Bucknell's 26 varsity athletics programs and greatly expands the scope of its growing intramural and recreational sports offerings. A visually appealing structure located along Moore Avenue on the "downhill" side of campus, the Langone Athletics and Recreation Center was designed to reach out to all members of the campus community, including the student body, varsity student-athletes, faculty, staff and alumni.

Three primary venues lie within the facility: the Arthur D. Kinney Jr. Natatorium, the 4,000-seat Gary A. Sojka Pavilion and the Krebs Family Fitness Center, which includes the Berger Family Weight Room. Other features include a new location for the Bucknell Athletics Hall of Fame, a display of Bucknell's Congressional Medal of Honor recipients, a sports medicine and athletic training suite, classrooms, modern offices for coaches and staff and increased locker room space for varsity and recreational athletes.

The building was formally dedicated on Apr. 25, 2003, in honor of noted entrepreneur and philanthropist Ken Langone, a 1957 Bucknell graduate who, along with his wife Elaine, pledged \$11 million toward the center's construction. Langone was a member of the university Board of Trustees from 1980 to 1996.

One of the special qualities of the Langone Athletics and Recreation Center is the manner in which it supplements the pre-existing facilities. The brand new construction surrounds Gerhard Fieldhouse and historic Davis Gymnasium, which has been restored as a competition venue for the Bison volleyball team, as well as intramural, recreation and other varsity practice activities.

FACULTY JOIN COACHING RANKS: BUCKNELL'S UNIQUE SIDELINE COACHING PROGRAM

One of the special programs that Bucknell offers in order to enhance the student-athlete's overall experience at the University is the Faculty-Administrator Sideline Program. The program involves a member of the faculty or administration at Bucknell being invited by one of the 26 varsity teams to become a part of the team's contest preparation by being involved in all aspects of the program, including game-day activities.

The faculty participant will discuss the overall program with the respective coaching staff, including recruiting philosophy and strategy for the upcoming contest. The sideline coach will attend a practice session where he/she will be introduced to the team and gain a truly

unique insight into the relationships that exist between player-coach and player-player. In addition, the practice session allows the participant to learn coaching techniques, strategy, terminology, and the athletes' true enthusiasm for the sport.

The participant will then attend the actual intercollegiate contest itself and be a part of the total event from pre-con-

test to post-contest, through timeout discussions and halftime teaching-learning methodology.

The purpose of the Faculty Sideline Program is to foster a better understanding by the faculty and administration of the roles played by coaches and athletes in the University's intercollegiate athletic arena.

STUDENT-ATHLETE ADVISORY COMMITTEE

"The mission of the NCAA Student-Athlete Advisory Committee is to enhance total student-athlete experience by promoting opportunity, protecting student-athlete welfare, and fostering a positive student-athlete image."

The SAAC provides insight on the student-athlete experience and to offer input on the rules, regulations, and policies that affect student-athletes' lives on NCAA member institution campuses.

The SAAC has been involved in various projects including: visits to local elementary schools, hospitals, and housing authorities; promotion of B.A.A.D. (Bucknell Athletes Against Drugs and Alcohol); and helping to hire a part-time trainer for the Athletic Training Office.

The Patriot League is proud of its mission of promoting opportunities for "Today's Scholar-Athletes, Tomorrow's Leaders." The League led NCAA Division I conferences in graduation rates for the fifth-straight year in 2003.

Patriot League graduates consistently excel as professionals in their chosen fields and are contributors to the betterment of society.

Patriot League teams and scholar-athletes are also achieving triumphs and accolades on the intercollegiate fields of competition:

Consider some recent team successes:

- Two PL teams advanced to their respective NCAA Championship game in 2003-04 (Colgate football and Navy men's lacrosse);
- The Patriot League advanced three teams to an NCAA Championship Tournament twice in the last two years (2002 men's soccer and 2004 men's lacrosse);
- The Patriot League has advanced a team to the quarterfinal round of the NCAA Division I-AA Football Championship five of the last six years, including three wins each by Colgate and Lehigh.

Individual achievements have been similarly impressive:

- Colgate junior Jamaal Branch won the 2003 Walter Payton Award as the outstanding Division I-AA football player;
- Three-time PL Volleyball Player of the Year Karla Kucerkova of American won her second-straight CoSIDA Academic All-American of the Year award in 2003;
- Bucknell's Molly Creamer was a first-round draft pick, No. 10 overall, by the New York Liberty in the 2003 WNBA draft. She was one of a handful of former PL standouts playing professional basketball overseas in 2003-04;
- Navy's Richie Meade was named the national Coach of the Year in men's lacrosse while sophomore Matt Russell was a first-team All-American and national Goalie of the Year;
- Colgate's John Frieser earned first-team Academic All-American honors, won two post-graduate scholarships and signed a free-agent contract with the NFL St. Louis Rams;
- Kevin Miller of Bucknell and Drew Bigna of Holy Cross were selected in the 2004 Major League Baseball June free-agent draft. It marks the sixth-straight year at least one Patriot League player was picked in the draft.
- A handful of men's soccer (Steve Fisher and Evan Bruno of Lehigh) and men's lacrosse (Army' Jeff Bryan along with Blaise Fletcher and Justin Sussman of Bucknell) players also were drafted or began professional playing careers this year.
- Navy's Billy Hurley capped his All-America collegiate golf career as the winner of the Byron Nelson Award and as a second-team CoSIDA Academic All-American.

The Patriot League's athletic success is achieved while remaining committed to its founding principle that student-athletes are academically representative of their class. Participation in athletics at Patriot League institutions is viewed as an important component of a well-rounded education.

The origins of Patriot League excellence date back to 1986 with the inception of a successful Division I-AA football conference. In 1990, the Patriot League expanded to an all-sports conference, now featuring 23 championship sports.

Full League members include American, Army, Bucknell, Colgate, Holy Cross, Lafayette, Lehigh and Navy. Associate members include Fordham and Georgetown for football and Villanova in women's lacrosse.

These member institutions are among the oldest and most prestigious in the nation. Alumni from Patriot League institutions have played a leadership role in the shaping of our country.

"The Patriot League — Today's Scholar-Athletes, Tomorrow's Leaders" is still the League's primary vision. However, the League is demonstrating annually that our student-athletes really can play.

KEVIN DONNER HEAD COACH 4TH SEASON

Kevin Donner, head coach of the men's and women's cross country and track and field teams at Bucknell, continued the success last season that earned him the title of Patriot League Coach of the Year in women's cross country and track in 2001-02.

Last season, Donner led both men's and women's cross country teams to fourth place finishes in the Patriot League including two first team all-league performers. During indoor season, Donner coached a Patriot League Championship squad in the Bucknell women's team while the men finished third in the PL. Outdoors, Donner saw the same results with the women winning the PL and the men placing third. Bucknell had nine individual event champions on the women's side during the indoor and outdoor seasons while the men recorded seven event runner-ups and one second place finish in a relay. Under Donner's coaching, Bucknell also saw two athletes receive bids to the NCAA Championships last season in Melanie Buczko in the pole vault and Maria Garcia in the hammer throw.

Beyond the Patriot League, Donner guided the two cross country squads to top-five finishes at their respective IC4A and ECAC championships, as well as top-10 finishes at the NCAA Mid-Atlantic meet. In track and field, following an indoor IC4A and ECAC finals in which more than a dozen Bucknell athletes competed, the Bison men finished 26th at the IC4A Championships while the women took 38th at their equivalent ECAC finals. From there, six athletes competed individually in the NCAA's East Regional meet.

This followed a year in which Donner guided the women's cross country and track teams to first-place sweeps of the three Patriot League championships as well as three second-place finishes on the men's side.

Before arriving at Bucknell in 2001, Donner, a native of Detroit, Mich., and a 1984 graduate of the University of Detroit, successfully transformed the Saint Francis program into one of the elite squads in the Northeast Conference. It was a banner campaign in 2000-01 for the Red Flash men's teams, as Saint Francis captured its second straight NEC cross country title, followed by indoor and outdoor track and field titles as well. The cross country unit placed third at the Mid-Atlantic Regional and vaulted to a Division I national ranking of 26.

Donner also guided the Red Flash women to an NEC cross country title in 1997 and the men's and women's cross country teams to All-Academic Team honors in each of the last five seasons. He was cited as the conference coach of the year in cross country and track and field seven times, and in 2000 he was honored as the top men's cross country mentor in the Mid-Atlantic Region. All 81 men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field school records were shattered under Donner's watch.

Among the stellar individual achievements by his Red Flash student-athletes were a cross country All-American, 40 men's and women's NEC titles, 27 all-conference performers, nine U.S. Junior National qualifiers, two Canadian National qualifiers and six CoSIDA Academic All-Americans.

Prior to his stint at Saint Francis, Donner served as assistant women's cross country and track and field coach at Central Michigan University from 1993-95. There, Donner coached eight All-Mid-American Conference performers and one NCAA qualifier.

Following his graduation from Detroit, Donner established a new varsity program at his alma mater, becoming the school's first-ever women's coach. He served a nine-year stint at Detroit, where he coached 20 All-Midwestern Collegiate Conference student-athletes and guided the women's cross-country program to back-to-back MCC titles in 1986 and 1987.

A member of the NCAA Division I Coaches Associations for cross country and track and field, Donner took over the reins of a Bucknell program that has listed among the elite in the East for the better part of two decades. Bucknell's women's cross country team has captured four of the past five Patriot League titles, while the men's team has won three of the last six conference meets. Similarly successful on the track, the Bison women have earned four of the last five Patriot League outdoor titles and five of the last six indoor championships. All told, the Bucknell men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field squads have captured 17 Patriot League championships in 13 years, while never finishing lower than third.

Donner will continue to be charged with adding to Bucknell's academic tradition. As head coach, Donner assisted 78 athletes to Patriot League Academic Honor Roll accolades in 2003-04.

Donner owns USATF level I and II coaching certifications in endurance and throws. He currently resides in Lewisburg with his wife Amy, a statistics instructor at Bucknell.

JOE KLIM
ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH
9TH SEASON

The Bucknell track & field program has seen much success since Joe Klim arrived on the Lewisburg scene back in August of 1996.

Coach Klim oversees the sprinters, hurdlers, and multi-event athletes.

Klim's women's athletes have produced 14 school records, 63 top-five performances, 95 top-10 performances, and a total of 13 Patriot League team championships (four cross country, five indoor, four outdoor). On eight different occasions, he was a member of the coaching staff recognized as the Patriot League Staff of the Year. On the men's side, Klim's athletes have produced 10 school records, 33 top-five performances, and 54 top-10 performances. He also coached sprinter/jumper Noel Powell to a provisional qualifying spot at the NCAA Championships.

During his two-year stay at Emory University prior to Bucknell, Klim helped lead the Eagles' men's and women's track & field teams to their first conference championships. While at Emory, Klim was part of a coaching staff which garnered UAA Conference Coaching Staff of the Year honors in 1995 & 1996 for men's indoor and in 1996 for men's outdoor.

After 13 years of coaching at the collegiate level, Klim has helped lead seven teams to their first-ever conference title, and has won a total of 20 conference championships. In addition, he has developed national qualifiers in 14 different events with an outcome of All-Americans in the high jump, triple jump, decathlon and 400 meter dash.

Klim graduated from Elmhurst College in 1991 with a bachelor of science degree in marketing. He earned his master of education degree with an emphasis in physical education from Campbell University in 1994. As an athlete at Elmhurst, Klim won several honors including Athlete of the Year in 1990. He joined the Elmhurst Hall of Fame member in 1997. Klim served as Elmhurst's head cross country and track & field coach for the 1991-92 season.

Besides his coaching duties at Bucknell, Klim is the recruiting coordinator for the cross country and track & field teams. Klim holds both a USATF Level I coaching certification as well as a USATF Level II certification for the jumps, throws, endurance events and multi-events. Klim currently resides in Boalsburg with his wife, Nittaya, who he married this past summer.



MARIO WILSON
ASSISTANT COACH
3RD SEASON

Mario Wilson works with the Bison jumpers and is entering his third season with the program. The 2004 track and field season was marked by tremendous improvements in the jumping events, especially at both Patriot League Championships.

Wilson has coached 10 Patriot League individual champions, nine of them in 2004 and 19 All-Patriot League performers in two seasons. Five school records were set by Wilson's athletes in 2004 as well as Patriot League records in three events. Several of Wilson's athletes also represented Bucknell at the ECAC Championships, earning All-East recognition in the jumping and relay events. Wilson has also coached an ECAC champion in the pole vault and a total of 33 IC4A/ECAC qualifiers in six years of coaching. At the national level, Wilson guided five athletes to the NCAA East Regional Championship and one athlete, Melanie Buczko, to a spot in the 2004 NCAA Outdoor Championships.

Prior to Bucknell, Wilson spent four years as an assistant coach at Saint Francis University where he was responsible for the jumping, hurdling and throwing events. At Saint Francis, Wilson coached one NCAA provisional qualifier, six All-IC4A/ECAC performers, four Northeast Conference record holders and 32 school record performances.

Wilson is a 1998 graduate of Marist College and completed his masters of education while at Saint Francis. Wilson resides in Lewisburg.



BOB SCHANBACHER
ASSISTANT COACH
14TH SEASON

Bob Schanbacher enters his 14th season working with the Bison throwers. This is his sixth season back with the Bucknell coaching staff after taking a three-year sabbatical from the program.

His first stint with the Orange and Blue lasted eight seasons, from 1988-1996. During that time, his athletes captured most of the school records in the men's and women's throwing events.

Schanbacher is responsible for shaping the reputation and tradition of success in the throwing events at Bucknell University. Schanbacher has coached 38 individual conference champions, athletes who have set 25 school records, several ECAC/IC4A scorers as well as an NCAA All-American in the hammer throw (James Heizman).

In his 13 seasons as a member of the Bison coaching staff, Schanbacher has helped coach Bucknell to 21 East Coast Conference and Patriot League Championships. His programs enjoyed remarkable success in the 1988-89 and 1989-90 seasons, when both the men's and women's indoor and outdoor track teams won all four ECC Championships.

A 1973 graduate of East Stroudsburg University and the recipient of a master's degree from Wisconsin-La Crosse, Schanbacher had been the head coach of track & field at Lewisburg High School since 1973 and the head coach of cross country from 1980-1987. He led teams to 14 conference championships including the West Branch Conference, Susquehanna Valley Conference (AA) and two District 4 AA titles. Coach Schanbacher is also a USATF Level II certified coach.

Schanbacher resides in Cogan Station with his wife Kathleen and daughter Amy (20). His son, Chris, is a student at Drexel University.



ROB GUISSANIE

Rob Guissanie is back with the Bison team for his third year as volunteer assistant coach. He will work mainly with the distance runners throughout the season and will be the head timer for the FinishLynx system at all home meets. Guissanie is a 1990 graduate of Penn State University. He was also head

cross country coach at Penn's Valley High School during the 1998-1999 seasons and track and field coach in 1998-2001.



JIM KNIGHT

A 1980 graduate of Bucknell, Jim Knight will serve his third season as an assistant coach for the Bison in 2004-05. Knight ran cross country and track for the legendary Art Gulden during his career at Bucknell. In 1979, he competed at the NCAA Championship in cross country and was an East Coast

Conference champion. Knight assists with the cross country runners and will aid with the men's and women's steeplechasers during the track season.



RACHELLE SMITH

Rachelle Smith returns to the Bison staff for a second season as an assistant coach, working with the jumpers and sprinters. Smith graduated from the University of Pennsylvania in 2002 following a career in which she won four letters on the Quaker track team as a jumper. Smith currently resides in Lewisburg while working on her masters of education at Bucknell. She works as the Tobacco Control Field Coordinator for tobacco prevention, education and cessation for the American Lung Association.



AIMING FOR THE TOP IN 2004

After fourth-place finishes for both the men's and women's cross country teams at the Patriot League Championships last season, Coach Kevin Donner is poised to move toward the team's ultimate goal of capturing two Patriot League crowns.

Both teams return the experience necessary to move up through the very competitive Patriot League ranks. The Bison women return six of the top seven runners who ran in last year's Mid-Atlantic Regional race. The men have four returning from last year's top seven competitors.

After a very low-key Bison Open event held at the Bucknell Golf Course, Donner and company will head to Northville, Mich., for the Detroit Titan Invitational followed by the Iona Meet of Champions in Bronx, N.Y., on September 25.

The Bison will run several courses on their schedule multiple times. Bucknell hosts the Gulden Invitational in early October in preparation to host the Patriot League Championships on October 30. The Bison will also race at the Penn State National Invitational in October before heading back to State College for the Mid-Atlantic Regional on November 13. Bucknell hopes to use the early races to preview the courses to gain experience for the championship portion of the 2004 season.

Following the regional meet, Bucknell will head to the IC4A Championships for the men and the ECAC Championships for the women held in the Bronx, N.Y., on Nov. 20. Last year, the Bison men finished fourth at the IC4A meet, while the women placed eighth in the team standings.

The NCAA Championship meet will be held on Nov. 22, in Terre Haute, Ind. Qualifiers for the national championships are based upon team and individual performances at the regional meet.

MEN'S PREVIEW

"I'm very excited about the upcoming season," said Donner of his 2004 men's squad.

Donner will rely on the returners from last year's NCAA Mid-Atlantic Regional squad to provide the needed experience to move up through the Patriot League Standings. The Bison men finished fourth in the league last season.

The Bison also return six other runners who competed in the 2003 Patriot League Championship meet. Stephen Schaeffer, Ryan Delaney,

Bill Duffy and Kevin Brown will also add experience to the 2004 team.

The Bison will also be joined by 10 freshmen including Wallace Campbell from Alabama and Michael Gibney from New York, who will add depth to the Bucknell squad.

The Bison are set on depth and experience and Donner is very impressed with his team's preseason preparation.

"Our men prepared themselves very well this summer and I am especially pleased with the fitness level of our sophomores."

"The Patriot League is one of the strongest leagues in the country with American, Navy and Army as our biggest competition."

Donner also expects a challenge from in-state rival Lehigh. "Lehigh has everyone back from a team that finished fifth in the Patriot League and 11th in the Mid-Atlantic Regional. I look for them to be a much improved team."

"If we can stay healthy and have some of our younger people step up, we should be able to compete for a Patriot League title," said Donner.

WOMEN'S PREVIEW

As far as experience goes, coach Kevin Donner could not ask for more from his 2004 women's cross country squad.

Six of his top seven runners are back and ready to run to the top of the Patriot League standings.

"With all our key runners back this season, our goal is to get back to the top of the Patriot League and be one of the top programs in the Mid-Atlantic Region," said Donner.

Senior co-captains Katie Pfeifer (Catonsville, Md.) and Jennifer Marsh (Clearfield, Pa.), juniors Kayla Halloran (Norwell, Mass.) and Julie Jakobowski (Tolland, Conn.), and sophomores Lauren Bricker (Greensburg, Pa.) and Jenny Stevens (Laceyville, Pa.) all ran in the NCAA Mid-Atlantic Regional meet last fall and all have the big-meet experience to vie for a Patriot League crown.

Several of Bucknell's harriers are also some of the top returners from the Patriot League meet. Pfeifer turned in an all-league performance by finishing ninth overall. Bricker and Halloran were second-team all-conference performers by turning in 15th and 20th place finishes.

"We have a lot to prove this year," said Donner about this year's squad. After great years in 2001 and 2002, we faltered at the end of the season last year due to injuries and inexperience."

The Bison also return sophomore Leanna Nastase (Beaverdale, Pa.). Nastase was one of Bucknell's top scorers in the early goings of the 2003 campaign but was sidelined due to injury towards the end of the season. She is now healthy and ready to contribute to her team throughout the entire season.

Nastase showed promise as a freshman by finishing 22nd at the Patriot League Championships, just seconds off an all-league performance.

The Bison will also get added depth from several other veteran runners. Juniors Kerryann Branker (Levittown, N.Y.) and Alison Cole (Waterville, Maine) return along with sophomore Mollie Harms (Sterling Heights, Mich.).

Cole was in and out of the team's top seven throughout the 2003 season and finished 27th at the Patriot League Championships.

The Bison will also look for added depth from a few promising freshmen. Donner and company hope that Erin

Cranmer-Hart's (Slippery Rock, Pa., Slippery Rock Area) sub-five-minute mile speed on the track will translate into a solid cross country performance.

Donner also has high hopes for freshmen Christine Totten from Perkasio, Pa. and Offeibe Hanson-Hall out of New Rochelle, N.Y.

turn the Patriot League individual champion in junior Keira Carlstrom, who earned All-America honors after finishing 16th overall at the 2003 NCAA Cross Country Championships.

"I expect a four-team race with American, Army and Navy at the Patriot League Championship," said Donner. "American has great front runners and Army has great depth. Navy was very young last year so I expect them to improve. Lehigh and Lafayette had some runners who had great outdoor track seasons last spring so I expect those two teams to be much improved."

Besides experience and depth, another advantage in Bucknell's attempt at a Patriot League crown will be the fact that Bucknell will host this year's league meet on its home course.

The Bison will take to their home course twice in the early season before running the Patriot League meet.

"The key for the women's team is to train hard and smart," said Donner. "We have the talent to be a good team if everyone stays healthy. We plan to improve throughout the months of September and October so we can peak in November."

After the league championships on Oct. 30, the Bison will also travel to two additional post-season meets, the NCAA Mid-Atlantic Regional and the ECAC Championships, where they hope to improve upon last year's 13th place finish at the regional and eighth place finish at the ECAC meet.





Legendary Bucknell cross country and track and field coach Art Gulden passed away in May of 2001. Gulden was at the helm of the Bucknell cross country and track and field programs for 31 years. Gulden led Bucknell to 68 conference titles and was named the Patriot League Coach-of-the-Year 20 times in the 11 years he coached in the conference.

Gulden's men's cross country teams, arguably Bucknell's most nationally-accomplished program, won 18 straight conference titles from 1975-92. At one point, men's cross country posted 167-straight dual meet wins, a streak spanning 16 years.

He sent men's teams to the NCAA Championships nine times in the last 21 years of his career and also saw the women receive an at-large selection to the NCAA meet in 1999 for the first time in school history.

He served in many positions in the world of cross country and track and field including stints as the president of the IC4A Cross Country and Track and Field Coaches Association and the U.S. Cross Country Coaches Association.

A 1964 graduate of Rutgers University, Gulden received his master's degree at Rutgers a year later. He served as a lieutenant in the U.S. Army for two years, then returned to Rutgers for three years before coming to Bucknell to begin his illustrious career with the Orange and Blue.

YEAR-BY-YEAR RESULTS

Over the past 34 years, the Bison men's cross country team has been Bucknell's most successful program on the national level. The Bison won 18 straight conference titles between 1975-92, and have appeared as a team in the NCAA Championships in nine of the last 24 years. The Bison had one of the most impressive winning streaks in all of collegiate sports snapped in 1990, when Connecticut handed Bucknell a dual-meet defeat. That halted a string of 167 consecutive dual-meet victories spanning 16 seasons. Since that loss to the Huskies, the Bison have gone 93-4 in dual-meet competition.

MEN'S TRACK AND FIELD PREVIEW 2004-05

The Bison men's track team will have the tough task of replacing several Patriot League scorers for the 2004 indoor and outdoor seasons. With the losses of Noel Powell in the sprints and jumps, Aaron Hanlon and Kevin Walsh in the mid-distances and Greg Costello in the distance events, the Bison will be looking for people to step up their performances and move Bucknell up through the Patriot League standings. The Bison return eight athletes who scored in Patriot League events last season and will rely on these competitors to lead the rest of the Bison with their scoring experience.

Sprints

Senior Ryan Newberger is the lone returning Patriot League scorer in the sprinting events. Last season, Newberger placed sixth in the 200-meters outdoors. Newberger also has IC4A meet experience to his credit. In 2003, Newberger was a scorer in both the 200 and 400 at both Patriot League meets. The Bison will also look for scoring production out of Newberger's supporting cast, including Matt Bonelli, Matt Corbetta and Nick Novotny. Freshman Matt Johnson will provide much-needed depth in the sprint group. The Bison placed fourth in the 4x400-meter relay at last year's indoor championships, a mark they hope to improve upon in the upcoming season. The Bison will also look for some points from the 4x100-meter relay team. Last season, Bucknell's quarter-mile relay placed second in the PL. Perhaps the most difficult task ahead of the Bison sprinters will be replacing all-league performer Noel Powell. Powell scored in four events last year and holds BU records in the 60, 100 and 200.

Hurdles

The Bison will look to senior Mike Mellas to lead the Bucknell hurdlers. Mellas will compete in the 55 meter-hurdles indoors as well as the 110-hurdles and 400-hurdles outdoors. Mellas is described by coaches as "one of the most improved athletes in Bucknell's history" and will be expected to score in several event areas. The team will also be looking for freshman Andre Campbell to be a contributor right away in the hurdles.

Jumps

The Bison jumps crew returns several scorers from the 2003-04 campaign. Mellas will look to repeat last year's performances, scoring in the triple jump both indoors and outdoors. Mellas is also the highest ranked returning jumper in the Patriot League. The Bison are expecting continued improvement from Mellas who has consistently bettered himself in both the long and triple jumps over his Bucknell career. The triple jump will be the deepest event for the Bison with five upperclassmen poised to score this year. Drew Folk is also back and looking to improve on his sixth-place finish in the high jump at last year's outdoor champion-

ships. Other returning scorers are sophomore Nick Novotny and junior Thomas Bennett, who finished fifth and sixth at last year's PL outdoor meet. Freshmen Dave Mante is also expected to have an immediate impact in the PL in the pole vault.

Mid-Distance

The Bison lost two Patriot League scorers in the mid-distance events in Aaron Hanlon and Kevin Walsh. Sophomore Adam Syty has the highest finish to his credit in the Bison mid-distances with a seventh place finish in the 1,000-meters at last year's PL indoor championships. Derrin Pierret and Mark Caroleo were the highest Bison finishers in last year's outdoor 1,500-meters and hope to improve upon their 10th and 11th place finishes. Pierret, Koran Evans and Chris Petillo all competed in the 800-meters in last season's indoor PL championships and will try to move into scoring positions.

Distance

Bucknell's top returner in the distance events is senior Dan Lounsbury. Lounsbury placed third in the 10,000 at last season's Patriot League Outdoor Championships. The Bison will have to recover from the loss of Greg Costello, who scored in four events last year and was an all-league performer in two of them. The Bison will look for other runners to add depth as well as points at the Patriot League meets. The Bison will count on experienced distance runners such as Doug Creveling, K.C. Brown, Kevin Forkiewicz, Matt Forsy, Chris Nocera, Travis Rivers and Ryan Delaney who are also some of Bucknell's top cross country runners.

Multi-Events

The Bison hope to get significant points from the multi-event area this season after getting a third place finish from Mellas in the indoor heptathlon last season as well as an all-league second-place performance in the decathlon outdoors. Bucknell will also look for sophomore Kyle McLaughlin to improve upon his sixth place finish in the decathlon to add more points to the Bison total.

Throws

The Bison will look for big improvements from the throws area of the team this season. "This area will be much improved this year," said Bison head coach Kevin Donner. "Coach Bob Schanbacher is a great teacher who can get the most out of his athletes." Josh Kaehler, the lone scorer in the throwing events last year, will be back after a sixth place finish in the javelin at last year's outdoor championships. Bucknell will also look to junior Dan Frake for much needed points in the shot put and the hammer throw. Bucknell will also look for help in the shot put from freshman James Meyer, who is considered a very promising newcomer. Nick Degregorio, a sophomore, will also be counted on in the shot put and the hammer after showing continued improvement last season.

WOMEN'S TRACK AND FIELD PREVIEW 2004-05

The Bucknell women's track and field squad looks to continue its Patriot League dominance entering the 2004 campaign as the defending champions for both the indoor and outdoor seasons. Since 1998, Bucknell has won six indoor Patriot League crowns and five outdoor titles. A title during the indoor season would be the fourth consecutive for the Bison women. The Bison seniors will look to cap off their careers and add two more titles to their total of five Patriot League Championships over their three years at Bucknell. The Bison women had nine event champions at last year's Patriot League meets while five others finished as the Patriot League runner-up.

Sprints

Bucknell returns an exceptionally strong and seasoned group of sprinters for the 2004-05 season. The Bison had a combined 10 scoring finishes at the 2004 indoor and outdoor Patriot League Championships including two Patriot League titles and several second and third-place performances. Senior Tolu Fayanjuola returns as the defending champion in both the 60-meter dash indoors and the 100-meter dash outdoors. Fayanjuola's championship performance of 7.75 seconds in the 60m is a Patriot League record. Danielle Todman and Erin Turner-Byfield will also cover the Bison short sprints. The Bison also return a strong core in the 400-meters. Bucknell swept the top three places in the event at the indoor championship meet. Leading the way was senior Amy Calvo followed by teammates Monique Boley and Rehana Lanewala. Calvo and Boley finished second and third at the PL outdoor meet. The 200-meters is another strong event for Bucknell with sophomore Sarah VandenBroek back with fifth (indoors) and sixth (outdoors) place finishes in the event. The Bison also have the 500-meters covered with Calvo, Boley and Mariel Fink back from second, third and fifth places at last year's indoor PL championships.

Hurdles

The Bison also look strong in the hurdle events led by sophomore Melanie Buczko, who is the defending Patriot League champion in the 60-meter hurdles. Bucknell also returns scorers in the outdoor hurdling events in sophomores Catherine Trentacoste and Christa Sawko. Sawko finished third in the 400-meter hurdles last season while Trentacoste placed sixth in the 100-meter high hurdles. The Bison will also count on Nina Reinhardt and Kat Allen to add depth to the already strong hurdle corps.

Multi-events

Todman and Reinhardt will take care of the multi-events this season in both the pentathlon indoors and the heptathlon outdoors. Both have already had success as newcomers to the event. Todman notched a fifth-place showing at the indoor PL championships as well as a third place performance at the outdoor meet.

Jumps

Bucknell looks to continue to dominate the Patriot League in the jumping events as the Bison had more all-league performers (11) in the jumps last year than all other schools combined. Returning scorers from the 2004

squad are Fayanjuola, Ann Doty, Lauren Bricker and Sarah Groman in the long, triple and high jump while Melanie Buczko and Angie Hall return in the pole vault. Of the scoring returners, Fayanjuola, a senior, leads a very young, but experienced group of sophomores. Fayanjuola is the defending indoor and outdoor Patriot League champion in the long jump as well as the league outdoor record holder. In the pole vault, Buczko is the defending indoor champion while Hall holds the crown outdoors. Buczko capped off an outstanding freshman campaign by finishing 11th in the pole vault at the NCAA Championships after winning the ECAC Championship in the event. The duo of Bricker and Doty swept the triple jump, taking first and second, at both last season's Patriot League meets.

Mid-Distance

The Bison mid-distance corps is in excellent shape as it returns sophomores Christa Sawko and Lauren Bricker and senior Jen Marsh. The trio of Sawko, Bricker and Marsh swept the top three places in the 800 at the Patriot League Indoor Championships. Bricker also recored a fifth place finish in the same event at the outdoor championships. Marsh is also a Patriot League scorer in the mile indoors and the 1,500 outdoors placing fourth in the mile and third in the 1,500 last year. Freshman Erin Cranmer-Hart, who broke the 5-minute barrier in the mile run in high school will also be expected to add to the Bison middle distance unit.

Distance

Like all the other events for the Bison women, the distance contingent is not lacking in big meet experience with three Patriot League scorers back for the 2004-05 season. Senior Katie Pfeifer returns as last year's leading scorer in the distance events, scoring in four events in last season's Patriot League competitions. Indoors, Pfeifer notched a fourth-place finish in the 5,000-meter run as well as a fifth-place showing in the 3,000-meter event. Outdoors, Pfeifer was the runner-up in the 10,000 and placed fourth in the 5,000. Junior Kayla Halloran also scored for the Bison, placing fourth in the 3,000 at the PL Indoor Championships. In the 5,000, junior Alison Cole scored for the Bison with a sixth-place finish.

Throws

In the throws, Bucknell traditionally has a strong core of throwers typically score significant points at the Patriot League Championships. This year's Bison throwers are confident they can continue that trend. Last year's Rookie of the Year, Marjorie Grap, returns from a year in which she scored in five events at the Patriot League Championship meets. Grap finished third in both the shot put and weight throw indoors before notching another third-place performance in the shot put at the outdoor PL Championships. Grap also qualified for the ECAC Championships in the shot put, discus and hammer. Senior Angie McFarland, an ECAC qualifier in the hammer, returns after scoring points for the Bison in the weight indoors and the hammer and discus outdoors. Senior Elizabeth Pendleton will be back in action after sitting out the 2004 season due to injury. Pendleton was a Patriot League scorer in 2003. The Bison are also excited about the arrivals of freshmen Amanda Mockbee and Beverly Rogers. Mockbee was all-state in Ohio in the shot put and discus while Rogers was an all-state performer in the javelin in Pennsylvania.







The new facility has attracted several outstanding teams to Lewisburg, including George Mason, Virginia, Duke and Syracuse. In addition, Gerhard Fieldhouse has played host to the Patriot League Championships three times.



CHRISTY MATHEWSON-MEMORIAL STADIUM

Bucknell's outdoor facility is 13,100-seat Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium. The current eight-lane Rekortan track, laid in 1989, was replaced in the summer of 2002. Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium has hosted three Patriot League Championships.



CROSS COUNTRY COURSE, BUCKNELL GOLF CLUB

The Bucknell cross country teams run on the challenging, scenic course of the Bucknell Golf Club. The men's course measures 8,000 meters, and the women's 5,000. Bucknell has hosted the Patriot League Cross Country Championships twice, and has also hosted the Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association (PIAA) State Championships.

THE ABC'S OF THE RECRUITING PROCESS

ADMISSIONS & APPLICATIONS

You can reach our Admissions Office by calling (570) 577-1101. To receive an application, please call our admissions office or send a written request to: Bucknell Admissions Office, Freas Hall, Bucknell University, Lewisburg, PA 17837.

CALENDAR

A typical recruiting calendar for a prospective student-athlete interested in cross country or track and field would go something like this:

- ** **Summer 2005** — Make unofficial visits to schools of interest.
- ** **September 2005** — Contact associate head coach Joe Klim if Bucknell falls within your top five list of potential colleges. Send a letter expressing interest in the cross country/track & field program. It would be helpful to include a transcript and any videotape you may have available. Also, the student-athlete should be registered with the NCAA Clearinghouse. See your high school athletics director or guidance counselor for information.
- ** **October 2005** — Coach Joe Klim will be in contact regarding the student-athlete's interest and possible visit date. The student-athlete and family should file CSS Financial Aid Profile Form. See your college guidance counselor for information.
- ** **November 15, 2005** — Deadline for Admissions and Financial Aid for Early Decision I.
- ** **Late December, 2005** — Target date for Admissions letters to go out for Early Decision I candidates.
- ** **January 1, 2006** — Deadline for Admissions and Financial Aid for Regular Decision and Early Decision II.
- ** **Late January, 2006** — Target date for Admissions decision letters to go out for Early Decision II candidates.
- ** **Late March, 2006** — Target date for Admissions decision letters to go out for Regular Decision candidates.
- ** **Mid-April, 2006** — Target date for open house weekend for all accepted applicants.
- ** **May 1, 2006** — Deadline for securing spot in class of 2010 with deposit.

CLEARINGHOUSE

The NCAA mandates that all student-athletes interested in competing at the Division I or II level be certified through the NCAA Initial Eligibility Clearinghouse. Contact high school coaches, athletics director and/or guidance counselor for necessary paperwork.

CONTACTS

As per NCAA by-law 13.02.3, a contact is any face-to-face encounter between a prospect or the prospect's parent or legal guardian and an institutional staff member or athletics representative during which any dialogue occurs in excess of an exchange of a greeting. Any such face-to-face encounter that is prearranged or takes place on the grounds of the prospect's high school, or at the site of organized competition or practice involving the prospect's high school, preparatory school, two-year college, or all-star team is considered a contact, regardless of the conversation that occurs. We are limited to three off-campus contact days per prospective student-athlete.

CORRESPONDENCE

It's important that the prospective student-athlete get in touch with coach Klim as soon as possible. A simple letter of inquiry into the cross country/track & field program will initiate the recruiting process. In the spring of your junior year or early senior year is the most appropriate time to contact Coach Donner.

ADMISSIONS DEADLINES

- November 15, 2005** — Early Decision I Application and Financial Aid deadline
- January 1, 2006** — Early Decision II and Regular Decision Application and Financial Aid deadline

EARLY DECISION

Students who are absolutely, 100% confident Bucknell is their top college choice are encouraged to apply during the Early Decision process. Advantages are that you'll have an Admissions decision prior to Christmas and all students accepted during the early decision process are guaranteed financial aid for which they qualify.

EVALUATIONS

As per NCAA by-law 13.02.6.1, an evaluation is any off-campus activity designed to assess the academic qualifications or athletic ability of a prospect, including any visit to a prospect's educational institution (during which no contact occurs) or the observation of a prospect participating in any practice or competition at any site. We are limited in our number of evaluations per prospective student-athlete.

FINANCIAL AID

Bucknell University does not offer athletic scholarships in the sports of cross country and track and field. All financial aid is awarded on the basis of need. Prospective student-athletes should complete the CSS "Profile Form" in the early Fall.

INTERVIEWS

Coach Joe Klim strongly encourages all prospective student-athletes to arrange for an on-campus interview with the Admissions Office. If it is not possible to interview on campus, alumni interviews are highly recommended. All interviews should be arranged through the Admissions Office by calling (570) 577-1101.

TELEPHONE CALLS

As per NCAA by-law 13.1.3.1, institutional staff members may not telephone a prospect (or the prospect's relatives or legal guardians) prior to July 1 following the prospect's completion of the junior year in high school. After July 1, institutional staff members may telephone a prospect once per week (measured Sunday through Saturday). The once-per-week limit applies to the entire institution.

VIDEO TAPES

In an attempt to make an accurate assessment early in the process, it is recommended videotapes be forwarded to associate head coach Klim's attention as soon as possible. The video need not be an elaborate production. Some simple meet or practice tape is sufficient.

VISITS, Official

According to NCAA by-law 13.7.1.2, a prospect may not make more than five expense-paid visits to NCAA member institutions, regardless of the number of sports in which the prospect is involved. An institution may not provide an expense-paid visit to a prospect who has not presented the institution with a high school (or college) academic transcript and a score from a PSAT, an SAT, a PACTplus, or an ACT test taken on a national testing date under national testing conditions. The official visit may not exceed 48 hours.

VISITS, Unofficial

According to NCAA by-law 13.8.1, a prospect may visit an institution's campus at the prospect's own expense an unlimited number of times and may make an unofficial visit before the prospect's senior year in high school.
