## Bison Great Jackson place named to All-Star Team for Second Time

For the second-consecutive season, former Bison lacrosse standout Jackson Place earned a spot on the [Major League Lacrosse All-Star Game roster](#).

Place, a 2014 Bucknell graduate and current Ohio Machine defenseman, will play in the MLL All-Star Game on Saturday, July 8 at Papa Murphy's Park in Sacramento, Calif. The contest will be broadcast on CBS Sports Network.

Place is one of four former Patriot League players who made the 2017 All-Star Game roster, joining Loyola's Scott Ratliff (D) and Joe Fletcher (D) and Colgate's Peter Baum (MF).

A four-year starting defenseman for the Bison, Place finished his collegiate career with 101 caused turnovers and 127 ground balls. As a senior, he was named to the All-Patriot League First Team and Honorable Mention All-American squad after ranking second in the country in caused turnovers per game (2.71).

In 2014, Place became the seventh Bison to be taken in the MLL draft when the Machine picked him in the fourth round. Since his selection, he has played in 38 career games for Ohio, totaling 82 ground balls and 26 caused turnovers. This season, he has posted 19 ground



balls and six caused turnovers in 10 contests.

At the 2016 MLL All-Star Game, Place suited up for Team Rolling Thunder, which fell by a narrow 21-20 margin to Team Riptide.



# Sid Jamieson

Elected to IMLCA Hall of Fame



Legendary Bucknell lacrosse coach Sid Jamieson has had plenty of practice writing Hall of Fame acceptance speeches, and now he will get to pen another as he has been elected to the Intercollegiate Men's Lacrosse Coaches Association (IMLCA) Hall of Fame. The induction ceremony will take place on Friday, Dec. 8 at the Baltimore Marriott Waterfront. Tickets are available for purchase at [www.IMLCACoaches.com](http://www.IMLCACoaches.com).

Jamieson, who launched Bucknell's varsity men's lacrosse program in 1968 and coached the team for 38 years, will be joined in the IMLCA Hall of Fame Class of 2017 by Dave Cottle (Loyola University Maryland and University of Maryland), Avery Blake Sr. (Swarthmore College, University of Pennsylvania), Tom Hayes (Drexel University, Rutgers University), Jack Kaley (New York Institute of Technology), Dick Szlasa (United States Naval Academy, Washington and Lee, Towson University), and Morris Touchstone (United States Military Academy, Yale University).

Jamieson's most recent Hall of Fame induction came last January, when he entered the US Lacrosse Central Pennsylvania Chapter Hall of Fame. He is already a member of the Pennsylvania Lacrosse Hall of Fame, the American Indian Hall of Fame, the Bucknell Athletics Hall of Fame, and the SUNY Cortland C-Club Hall of Fame.

Jamieson came to Bucknell in 1964 and started the varsity men's lacrosse program in 1968. He went on to coach the Bison until 2005, piling up 242 wins and seven conference championships while coaching 17 All-Americans.

In addition to his numerous achievements as Bucknell's head lacrosse coach, Jamieson made many off-the-field contributions locally, nationally and internationally. He was awarded the prestigious Burma-Bucknell Bowl, given for "outstanding contributions to intercultural and international understanding." In 1994, he took his team on a two-week tour of Japan to compete in the International Lacrosse Friendship Games. Bucknell played the Japanese National Team and participated in lacrosse clinics. That trip led to a young player from Japan, Taro Yoshitome, coming to the United States to study at Bucknell and play on the Bison lacrosse team, where he became a two-time First Team All-Patriot League selection.

Jamieson was a dynamic force on the international lacrosse scene through his involvement with the Iroquois National Team. Himself a Native American — his parents were both raised on the Six Nations Indian Reservation in Brantford, Ontario — Jamieson from 1983-86 served as head coach of the Iroquois Nationals, a team made up of Native North Americans from both the United States and Canada. Jamieson led the team to the 1984 World Lacrosse Games, a part of the pre-Olympic cultural events of the Los Angeles Summer Olympics. In 1985 he coached the team on a 10-day tour of England with the English National Team. Jamieson took the team to the World Lacrosse Championships in Perth, Australia, in 1990 while serving as the team's executive director, and he later served as an emeritus member of its executive board. ■

## Matt Dugan

*Named Assistant Coach*



**B**ucknell head men's lacrosse coach Frank Fedorjaka recently announced the addition of Matt Dugan to his staff as an assistant coach.

Dugan spent the past three seasons as an assistant coach at the University of Tampa, where he helped the Spartans reach the NCAA Division II tournament each year by winning the Sunshine State Conference championship.

The University of Tampa advanced to the NCAA semifinals in both 2017 and 2016. This past season, the Spartans fell to the eventual national champion, No. 1 Limestone College, by a tight 12-10 decision.

Dugan coordinated the University of Tampa's face-offs, recruiting, scheduling and travel. He was also the assistant director of Whipple Lacrosse, the company that man-

aged the team's camps.

Beginning in December 2016, Dugan served as the Director of Player Analytics for the Florida Launch, a Major League Lacrosse club. He was the first person to work exclusively in analytics for the Launch.

Before his time at the University of Tampa and with the Florida Launch, Dugan was an assistant coach at Tompkins-Cortland Community College. In 2014, he helped the Panthers reach the playoffs for only the second time in team history.

Dugan has also worked at summer camps run by Marist College and Hamilton College. He held

positions with D&B Sportswear, O'Connell Sports Management and Armideo Real Estate.

A three-year starter and primary face-off man at Marist College, Dugan graduated in 2013 with a B.S. in Business/Finance. During his time as a Red Fox, he twice posted a face-off percentage north of .510 and finished in the MAAC's top five in ground balls three times.

Dugan played three years of high school lacrosse for Christian Brothers Academy. A member of the 2017 Section III Class C Section Championship team, he was named to the all-league second team as a junior and senior. ■
